

FROM FATHER ANDREW

My Dear Friends,

The season of spring started a couple of weeks ago with the Spring Equinox on 20th March. This is the time of year when we begin to think about a fresh start and getting ourselves in to a more energetic frame of mind than we might have had during the winter months. This is true for many of us who have a few more birthdays under our belt than we would care to think about; when we were young, it certainly seemed that all year round was a wonderfully exciting spring time with endless possibilities and opportunities.

It seems very different for those who are young at the beginning of the 21st Century as they face criticism by others and are more vulnerable and less resilient than those of former generations, especially people who lived through the world wars of the last century who were called to do quite remarkable things, often making the supreme sacrifice at a very young age. A report a couple of years ago suggested that today's' generation of under 25s would for the first time for many decades have a less affluent lifestyle than their parents: in other words, progress in living standards has stopped and even gone backwards for some groups. We have heard recently that we are now at a point that for the 18-34 age group more of them are living with their parents than with a partner which has not been the case since 1945. Similarly, the prospect of owning their own home is more elusive for young people than a generation ago.

The term given to children born between the mid 1980s and early 2000s is Millennials or Generation Y. Commentators sometimes call these young people the 'snow flake generation' because they seem too sensitive, over praised and easy offended. Certainly in comparison with those of the last century I mentioned earlier Millennials express their feeling more opening, but this is not a particularly bad thing. Criticism of this generation leads to a rather discontent and resentful attitude from older people who we might expect to set an example.

We should remember that it was the Millennials who overwhelmingly voted to remain in the EU because their outlook and passion is centred on their love for the flexibility and openness offered by modern society. In general they want make a success of life and are energetic and hopeful wanting to make the world a better place

So where does this lead us in the church. Many people think of religion as being an activity only for older people. It is true that the Church of England in particular has always has had an older age profile – something that we conveniently forget when we complain about the lack of young people in church.

We would do well to remember that Christianity as a movement has as its leader Jesus, who was a young man when he went in to the desert to reflect on what the rest of his life had in store. The disciples were young and energetic people, full of hope of the possibility a new start. In his three short years of teaching and mission Jesus Christ gathered round him a group who desired to know God by being driven by spirit to test themselves. When he died young, Jesus had managed to change the course of history through this youthful determination. Each of us has a reflection of that determination inside, the younger version of ourselves when we believed in bigger things and hoped for something deeper.

In spring we should remind ourselves that we are forever young as this is the potential of God within each and every one of us.

THE DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND AT HOME

The Bishop has granted permission to five people in our Parish to distribute Holy Communion in Church, in the Chapel and in the home. If you know of someone, who would like to receive Holy Communion at home, please contact either Margaret Stewart (01257 792692) or Jean Heaps (01257 793034).

KERBS

The kerbs around the gravestones, in the Churchyard, make the maintenance of the Churchyard so much harder and so much more time-consuming. Mowers and strimmers cannot operate between the kerbs. We feel the Churchyard looks much more well-kept when the kerbs are removed.

If you have a grave with kerbs in the Churchyard please consider asking us to remove them. If enough people agreed to this we could raise up the low areas with soil to create a beautiful well-kept lawned Churchyard.

Please consider our request. We would also like to remind everyone that the use of weed killer in the Churchyard is forbidden. Thank you.

GIFT AID

If you are a taxpayer please consider joining the gift aid scheme. For every £1 you give we can reclaim an extra 28p from the Inland Revenue. If you contribute to the Church by standing order or the envelope scheme you only need to complete one simple form. However, if you are used to placing cash on the plate and you are a taxpayer then please use and complete one of the envelopes in the pews (or at the back of the Church). If you need any help please ask us. Your support in this matter is very much appreciated.

CHURCHYARD MONUMENTS

It is the responsibility of the Parochial Church Council to maintain a safe graveyard. Over the years, sometimes not so many years, monuments become loose. It is the responsibility of families to ensure that their monument is safe and secure. We urge you to check your monument and if there is any movement please instruct someone to make it safe.

The Parochial Church Council decided that if any are found unsafe steps will have to be taken to lay them flat. We do not want to have to do this, but safety in the graveyard is of paramount importance and we will have to do what is necessary.

VICARAGE

As the vicarage is let out to private tenants please ensure all correspondence intended for the Vicar, Churchwardens, or Parochial Church Council is left at the Church, or given to the Church-wardens, or any member of the Parochial Church Council.








Exciting news from the school Governors

New Classroom

We are delighted to be able to share good news with you regarding our long held plans to expand the school by providing a new classroom.

As a highly successful and growing school, pupil numbers have increased over the past few years, which means that the current accommodation is inadequate. We needed an extra classroom and, as a temporary measure, we were able to rent a room in the Uniformed Group's Building across the school playing field. This provided a welcome temporary solution, but the headteacher and governors have continued to pursue the goal of building another classroom on to the main building.

Last Autumn we put in a bid for a share of the funding allocated to the Church of England Voluntary Aided schools in the diocese. Despite the current economic climate of cuts to schools, at the beginning of March we were thrilled to hear that our bid had been successful. This means that, at last, our plans for the new classroom will become a reality, and we look forward to the next exciting phase in the expansion and development of Christ Church Charnock Richard C E Primary School.


These letters are only sent to schools who obtain the highest levels of attainment throughout England, so we are all very proud of these results which put us in the top 1,000 primary schools in the country.

Christ Church Charnock Richard C of E Primary School

Children from Year 4, had an exciting visit to an explosive food show, at St Laurence's Primary School, hosted by The Ogden Trust.



'Explosive Food' featured exciting and fascinating chemistry and physics demonstrations, which gave us an insight into the Science behind some of the foods we eat.

The children loved seeing every day foods, being used in an unusual way, to create explosions.

This term in Year 3 we have been learning about Britain's history from the Stone Age through the Bronze Age and Iron Age. We had a visit from History Alive, who brought in fantastic Stone Age artefacts for us to look at such as authentic tools, pots and weapons. The children got to dress up as our ancient ancestors and had a terrific time.

In class we built Stone Age style houses from materials found in the Woodland Garden, which helped us to think about housing back in time.

We looked at the diet of Stone Age hunter-gatherers and cooked some dishes of our own such as Stone Age Stewed Fruit.

CONSULTATION ON PHASE III PROPOSALS AT MOSSIE CLOSE PLAY AREA

The Parish Council has received some funding from Chorley Council which they are planning to use on PHASE III enhancements to Mossie Close Play Area, at the rear of the houses on Leeson Avenue and Willow Drive, and would like to determine the views of the residents, all school children and young people of Charnock Richard on the following suggestions:

- 1) The inclusion of a Multi-Use-Games-Area (MUGA) on the site. An area with a hard tarmac surface which would meet the needs of multiple sports within one play area whether it is netball, football, hockey, cricket or basketball.

OR

- 2) A Zip-Wire, a Viking Swing, a See-Saw, and a Rocking Horse.

It is hoped that the provision of either of these schemes, will add to the existing play provision, will enhance the leisure, play and amenities available to the young people of the Parish and, will make Mossie Close Play Area an all-age inclusive play space for Charnock Richard.


