## FROM FATHER ANDREW

August is the month when the whole of France abandons the city and heads south or west to the coast; whilst our holiday season is less concentrated many people take advantage of school holidays and good weather to get away for a main holiday. It is a very human desire to want to get outside and enjoy the better weather, especially for people living in the United Kingdom, with its unremarkable, even miserable weather for much of the year. It is also a time we look forward to, illustrated by January being the busy month for people booking holiday. Most of us look forward to going on holiday or just spending time with family and friends. Of course, there is a feel good factor about doing something special which we are not able to do for much of the year.

But where is God in the middle of all these human desires for a change of scene and what is known these days as 'me-time'? After all, leading a Christian life is supposed to take the focus off our own interests as we focus on God. In fact I think enjoying summer and spending time with those we are most attached to is a very theological thing to do. You may remember the song Turn, turn, turn made famous by The Byrds in 1965: the lyrics are taken from the Old Testament Book of Ecclesiastes.

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

a time to be born, and a time to die;  
a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;  
a time to kill, and a time to heal;  
a time to break down, and a time to build up;  
a time to weep, and a time to laugh;  
a time to mourn, and a time to dance.

In this passage which was written around 400 years before Jesus was born and when the Jews were under pressure to compromise their faith, we are reminded of God's wisdom and that life is pointless and futile without God as nature and history go round in circles. In this context we can see how God wants us to enjoy all his creation and take our part in it, particularly during the summer holidays; as the author of Ecclesiastes says there is a proper time for everything in life because God has made it so and whilst we understand time, perhaps the next seven weeks of school holidays, we cannot comprehend the extend of God's work. And when you think about this, it is a really hopeful prospect because rather than feeling guilty about enjoying ourselves or time off work, we can be sure that we are here to enjoy and use the whole of creation.

During the summer period we enjoy festivals of all kinds, whether it is a summer fair, walking day or a music festival. These are all events which celebrate the life and vitality of creation, something that God wants us to participate in and understand that he is at the centre.

Do have a wonderful time of relaxation and refreshment in the coming weeks remembering that it is God's will that we enjoy ourselves and make the most of the world He created for us. All that is asked in return is that we do the very best we can in all we do, we do something creative with our time and we are faithful and love Him.

Our Annual Procession of Witness was held at the beginning of July and I would like to thank most sincerely everyone who helped with the traffic management, without your help the procession would not have taken place. David, a retired police officer, stepped in at the last minute after the sudden illness of David Cowell, another retired police officer. The marshals did a brilliant job keeping our participants safe and I am happy to report David Cowell is now fighting fit again.

At the start of the walk we held a short ceremony to lay up the Scout's original flag which had been entrusted to the unit over 60 years ago. Three other children have written and illustrated a book entitled "Money doesn't grow on trees". This is part of a project about money management led by Mr. Brian Souter, former Deputy Headteacher of Southlands High School, who many of you will remember. Brian retired from Southlands High School but is now heavily involved in Debt Aware Foundation, a registered charity, teaching money skills for life. You will find his article in this Chronicle.

I am very pleased to report the Potting Shed Team meets every Monday morning at 10.00am in the Almshouses grounds. At the moment there are eight members of the team, occasionally one or two are missing as a result of holidays or other commitments, but the others continue their good work. ## THE DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND AT HOME

The Bishop has granted permission to five people in our Parish to distribute Holy Communion in Church, in the Chapel and in the home. If you know of someone, who would like to receive Holy Communion at home, please contact either Margaret Stewart (01257 792692) or Jean Heaps (01257 793034).

## KERBS

The kerbs around the gravestones, in the Churchyard, make the maintenance of the Churchyard so much harder and so much more time-consuming. Mowers and strimmers cannot operate between the kerbs. We feel the Churchyard looks much more well-kept when the kerbs are removed.

If you have a grave with kerbs in the Churchyard please consider asking us to remove them. If enough people agreed to this we could raise up the low areas with soil to create a beautiful well-kept lawned Churchyard.

Please consider our request. We would also like to remind everyone that the use of weed killer in the Churchyard is forbidden. Thank you.

## GIFT AID

If you are a taxpayer please consider joining the gift aid scheme. For every £1 you give we can reclaim an extra 28p from the Inland Revenue. If you contribute to the Church by standing order or the envelope scheme you only need to complete one simple form. However, if you are used to placing cash on the plate and you are a taxpayer then please use and complete one of the envelopes in the pews (or at the back of the Church). If you need any help please ask us. Your support in this matter is very much appreciated.

## **CHURCHYARD MONUMENTS**

It is the responsibility of the Parochial Church Council to maintain a safe graveyard. Over the years, sometimes not so many years, monuments become loose. It is the responsibility of families to ensure that their monument is safe and secure. We urge you to check your monument and if there is any movement please instruct someone to make it safe.

The Parochial Church Council decided that if any are found unsafe steps will have to be taken to lay them flat. We do not want to have to do this, but safety in the graveyard is of paramount importance and we will have to do what is necessary.

## **VICARAGE**

As the vicarage is let out to private tenants please ensure all correspondence intended for the Vicar, Churchwardens, or Parochial Church Council is left at the Church, or given to the Church-wardens, or any member of the Parochial Church Council.






## CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL



## CHARNOCK RICHARD SCOUT GROUP

As part of their learning towards the Global Challenge award, our Charnock Richard Scouts recently took part in a group visit to the Gujarat Hindu Society Temple, in Preston.


The Gujarat Hindu Society was established in 1965 to cater for and service the needs of the local Hindu community in Preston. As well as providing a religious centre, the GHS engages with the local community, providing sport and recreational facilities, education, social services, and a cultural centre. It runs over thirty different activities with the help of volunteers and paid staff, working in partnership with various public and voluntary organisations in the area.

They were certainly very friendly and welcoming to our group. After removing our shoes, we were shown around the beautifully ornate main room of the temple, where worship and meditation takes place.

Our guide was a former Mayor of Preston, who gave us a fascinating explanation of the main principles of the Hindu religion. He explained how the various deities worshipped in the temple are all different aspects of Vishnu, in a similar way to our Holy Trinity being three different aspects of God. We were free to ask him questions, and we all enjoyed an open, interesting philosophical discussion!

The Scouts learned a lot; not just about Hinduism, but about spiritual and moral belief in general, and we all left with a new understanding and appreciation of a part of our multicultural society.

Since we started collecting 20 pence pieces we have raised £1063.95, and since we started the Coffee Mornings we have raised £1169.45. Thank you all so much.

Those of you who know me will have heard me say so many times how important these buildings are to this village. They are part of our heritage here, they are part of the Darlington Triangle along with the Church and the Almshouses. We have the responsibility of preserving these buildings for the benefit of future generations. They are used by so many groups in our village and are available for hire by other groups or clubs, or by individuals for children's parties or wedding receptions, they would be particularly suitable if you were looking for a country theme.

Our Pre-School uses these buildings five days each week, the "Miss Burgess" room is used exclusively by Pre-School, the main hall gives them plenty of additional space, there is a secure playground area between the school and the almshouses, and, on top of this, there is the Old School garden and memorial garden.

Our Pre-School is managed by dedicated members of staff, who are all highly trained and well experienced. They have increased their hours of usage over the past few years and they now offer a Breakfast Club which is obviously a great help to working parents. They also remain open until 5.00pm in the afternoon. They have recently been inspected by Ofsted, their overall assessment was "Good", but they were awarded "Outstanding" for Personal development, behaviour and welfare.

The Pre-School is a place where children learn through play. Our Pre-School provides a rich and stimulating indoor and outdoor play environment in a safe and secure setting which enables children to learn through meaningful play experiences. I speak to some of the parents whose children attend our Pre-School and they tell me their children are very happy there and the parents are very impressed with the activities undertaken and the progress the children have made. 



## THE ROAD TO THE OPEN 2017

The 146th Open Championship was played just down the road at the magnificent Royal Birkdale Golf Club. Jordan Spieth from the USA won becoming 'Champion Golfer Of The Year' and clinching the Claret Jug at just 24 years old – fantastic.

For me, The Open was an opportunity. I work for a charity called The Golf Foundation and have done for the last 10 years. The Golf Foundation's aim is to provide golfing opportunities for children and young people and we do this by funding golf clubs to offer golf in schools and the community and then progress into golf facilities for further learning. The Open, the biggest golf competition in the world, always provides us with a great opportunity to shine the spotlight on what we do. I have been involved with two big projects; The Road To The Open and The National Street Golf Competition. The Road To The Open provides Lancashire Golf Clubs with a platform to promote themselves while The Open is in the county. The National Street Golf Competition is about engaging with young people through Premier League Football Club community projects and offering them golf. We held the final at Formby Hall during the week of The Open and the participants went on to Birkdale to watch the golf after they had played – very inspiring for all. Sky Sports News attended to cover the event and my interview resulted in me being asked to write something for the Charnock Richard Chronicle.

During the rest of the week I was involved with delivering fun sessions in the Swing Zone where we arranged for local school groups to run trips to The Open. We were delivering fun Tri-Golf sessions to the groups and the general public – it was very well received. 15,000 under 16's attended The Open this year.

On a local note, in Charnock Richard we are very lucky with the golf that we have access to. The Yarrow Valley 9 –hole golf course on Church Lane is one of the best short courses in the area. Phil, Barbara and family have always maintained a fabulous golf course and provided an excellent service to back it up. The course is both great for beginners but also provides a challenge to more experienced golfers. The views around the course are magnificent.

My first job in golf was at Yarrow Valley in 1998 and helped with maintenance, I did enjoy that. The former Charnock Richard Golf Club, 18 hole golf course on Preston Road is due to re-open as a 9 hole course in 2018. With a barrier to golf participation being time and cost, this is great as it will be a full size 9 hole course and is needed in the Chorley area.

I currently volunteer at Duxbury Park Golf Course providing opportunities for children to start playing golf.


